Todd & Stela on Medical Furlough

Due to Todd's increasing medical issues, Todd and Stela came to the United States in March this year. With a new team of doctors and a significant reduction in medications, Todd started to improve. However, it was discovered during testing that Todd had heart issues and needed multiple bypasses. He had bypass surgery in May and had five bypasses. The surgery was successful but while recovering he had a heart attack. He has had multiple major medical things occur. After his heart attack on Memorial Day, he spent about 2 months in



the hospital, including weeks in the Cardiac ICU, cardiac floor, and then Methodist Rehab. He was able to come home at the end of July but had to have dialysis multiple times a week. He was also getting home health services.



He has since completed rehab and stopped dialysis. His hemodialysis port was surgically removed in September. Even though he is no longer having dialysis, his kidneys need much more healing before he can return to Brazil.

Primary prayer requests for him to move forward are:

- 1) the continual improvement of his kidney function so that he can remain off dialysis
- 2) easing the pain in his chest and extremities due to the powerful medicines he was on to keep him alive, and the stress put on his body through all of his medical problems
- 3) improving his memory and cognitive function, as the medicines and machines he was on can affect this and takes months of recovery.

We are extremely grateful to Our Lord Jesus Christ for the Miracle of Life and for the opportunity to continue serving Him wherever He sends us. To Him be all Glory, Honor and Praise!

A Record Drought

The Sanabani River hit its record drought in recorded history! The river drained from a level of 44 feet to zero. Wow, talk about pulling the tub stopper! This has created many problems for ARM and the villagers. Our former houseboat, the Luz Da Vida, sits on dry ground near the mission camp. The river is the primary form of travel in this region. So, staying in contact with the villagers has been a challenge like never before.





Villagers had to build small walking platforms to pass over the now quicksand-like river bottom!

No large boats can travel at all, and only small canoes with very small motors can travel the few places where some water remains. Aside from travel, the villagers depend on the river for food, bathing and washing, and drinking. The drought has affected many aspects of daily life for these people.

Ministry Continues

While Todd and Stela have been in the United States, Polly and Nelson Rossetti have been leading the mission work on the river. They have been continuing the work of visiting villages, sharing the gospel, leading Bible studies both in the villages and at the mission house. They have been helping Todd and Stela for 11 years, and now God has called them to continue the work while Todd and Stela are on furlough in the USA.

We talked about Jesus to the children who were our target audience and the parents and adults who were present also heard about Jesus.

And Sister Polly and Brother Nelson who were at the forefront of this mission in these days, strong and courageous, may the Lord bless them more and more every day.

Normally we take our launch boat, Nova Vida, to the villages. However, since the Sanabani River had no water, we had to carry all the supplies by hand to the villages.

Each community visited on Children's Day started days before the event, with visiting community members in their homes. Visits included Bible reading and discipling those who are already believers, and sharing the gospel with those who weren't.

After a week of these visits, the villagers met at their village's community center for the celebration of Children's Day. Children's Day included Bible stories, music, a meal, and lots of fun and games. Each child who attended received a gift of a toy for the holiday.

Our missionary team had to walk miles on sandy beaches to carry trunks of toys for the Children's Day Event.
